\* The "Rare Item Drop Rate" represents the chance that the RNG will award a "Rare" (Gold) item, which can be a knife, glove, or stat-trak variation of a high-tier skin. The exact likelihood for each particular skin within that tier is a separate, concealed estimation.

The table shows that while many cases cost just a few dollars, the likelihood of landing a high-value skin stays very low. Players should for that reason see case opening as a type of entertainment rather than a trusted financial investment.
