1. The AWP|Dragon Lore

A Factory New Souvenir Dragon Lore signed by superstar player Skadoodle famously offered for over £ 60,000 years back, and rates have just intensified because.

2. The AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 "Blue Gem")

While a standard Case Hardened AK-47 is relatively affordable, the top-tier pattern indices-- specifically Pattern 661-- cover practically the whole leading receiver of the gun in a pristine, reflective blue.
