

Buying a used 16 ft garage door can cut the upfront price of a garage door project, but the purchase only makes sense if the door matches your opening and does not require extensive garage door repair. Measure the Opening, Panels, Tracks, and Headroom

Measure the door opening from the finished floor to the top of the opening and from one side jamb to the other. Measure the width and height of every garage door panel, not just the overall exterior dimensions. The door opening should be square, with both side jambs plumb and the header even.

Record the distance from each side of the opening to the nearest wall or obstruction. Measure the vertical track, horizontal track, and the space behind the tracks. Also check the headroom clearance between the top of the opening and the ceiling or lowest obstruction. Standard lift systems require enough room for the rollers, horizontal tracks, springs, and opener rail.

Older Los Angeles garages may have unusual framing, low ceilings, or limited side clearance. A high-lift, low-headroom, or rear-torsion configuration may be necessary in some spaces. Check Material, Insulation, Condition, and Hardware

Garage door insulation can increase comfort in an attached garage and limit heat transfer into nearby rooms. Check the insulation thickness and construction with your current door. Examine all garage door hardware, including hinges, brackets, rollers, lift cables, drums, springs, and fasteners. Renew brittle or damaged weather seal and inspect the bottom seal for gaps. Weather stripping around the perimeter should touch the floor and jambs without causing too much friction.
