Why on-site service matters for Orlando homes

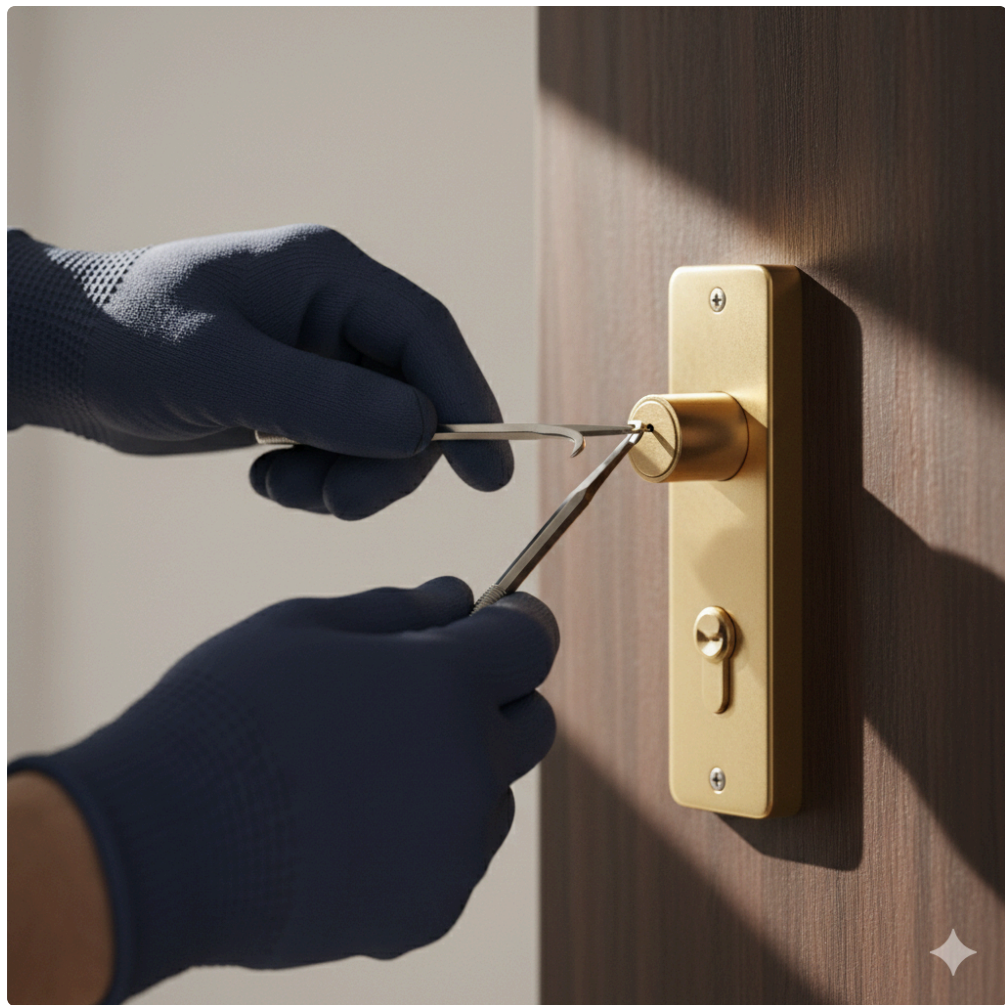
