

Holiday lighting that does not come down

Permanent holiday lights stay on the house. That single sentence covers most of why people want them. What is up there is an LED channel color matched to the house, which is why the house does not look decorated in July.

The calendar it covers

Christmas is the reason most people call, though it ends up being one setting among many. Orange for Halloween. Red, white and blue in July. Team colors on game day. A color for somebody's birthday. Green in March. And on the three hundred ordinary nights in between, it goes back to plain warm white, which is the setting that gets the most hours by a wide margin.

The process, briefly

The first step is a free consultation. The install is handled by the crew, not handed to you as a kit. After that, you have an app and a house that lights up.

The daytime question

The fair objection to permanent holiday lighting is the other eleven months. The track gets matched to the color of your trim or fascia and sits tight to the roof line, which is why it does not read as decoration in daylight.

Who these suit

The people happiest with permanent holiday lights do it every year without fail. It also works for people who should not be on a roof anymore, and that is more households than people say out loud. And it fits people who wanted the house lit at night anyway, holidays or not.

When to start

Everything happens ahead of the date you want it lit. It is easy to forget until the neighbors' lights go on. A consultation, a design drawn for the house, and an install date all sit somewhere on a calendar, and the calendar does not care when you thought of it. The good news is the sequence does not repeat. Next year there is no setup, no dead season, and no scheduling anything. The part people do not expect is how little they touch it after the first month. Set the season in advance and the house does it on its own. Dusk to whatever hour you choose, on a schedule, all season.

The other option, honestly stated

What is permanent outdoor lighting?

Permanent outdoor lighting is a fixed LED system installed along a building's roofline, eaves and architectural lines and left in place all year. The LEDs sit in a track that is color matched to the trim, and the system is controlled from a smartphone app. It replaces the seasonal strands that go up and come down each year.

Are the lights noticeable during the day?

The track is color matched to the trim or fascia and mounted tight along the edge of the roofline, so it is designed to stay discreet in daylight and read as part of the house rather than as decoration.

Does EverCrest Lighting install Christmas lights?

Yes. EverCrest Lighting installs Christmas and holiday lighting, and also installs permanent LED systems that handle holiday colors from an app. On traditional holiday lighting, EverCrest Lighting handles takedown at the end of the season and off season storage.
