* The "Rare Item Drop Rate" represents the chance that the RNG will award a "Rare" (Gold) product, which can be a knife, glove, or stat-trak variation of a high-tier skin. The exact possibility for each particular skin within that tier is a separate, undisclosed estimation.

The table demonstrates that while many cases cost only a few dollars, the probability of landing a high-value skin stays really low. Players ought to for that reason view case opening as a kind of home entertainment rather than a trusted financial investment.
