The legal requirements for a valid property settlement agreement in Virginia include that it must be in writing, signed by both parties, and either acknowledged before a notary [Criminal defense attorney](#) or signed in front of a witness. The agreement must be voluntary, with both parties having had the opportunity to understand the terms and seek independent legal advice. When a property settlement agreement is incorporated into a final divorce decree, its terms become enforceable as a court order. The content of a comprehensive property settlement agreement covers all marital assets and debts, not just the ones most obviously in dispute. This means addressing the marital home and any other real property, all financial accounts, retirement accounts and pension benefits, vehicles, personal property and furnishings, and all debts including mortgages, car loans, credit cards, and student loans.
