

Massapequa has a way of surprising people. On a map, it can look like another South Shore Long Island suburb with a convenient train stop and a healthy mix of homes, shops, and waterfront access. Spend a little time here, though, and the layers start to show. There is the old commuter-town rhythm tied to the South Shore Line and the bay, the local history that still shapes neighborhood identity, and the everyday practical side of living near salt air, storm weather, and tree-lined streets that shed pollen, tannins, and grime with the seasons.
