Step 1: Verify the Integrity of Game Files

The most basic and most effective initial step is letting Steam look for missing or damaged game files.

1. Open the Steam Library.
2. Right-click on **Counter-Strike 2** and choose **Properties**.
3. Browse to the **Installed Files** tab.
4. Click **Verify stability of video game files**.
5. Allow Steam to scan and replace any damaged files.

Action 2: Update Graphics Drivers

Action 3: Adjust In-Game Settings and Launch Options
